Bro. Chicago Joe Schuller, 25, was born in Harlingen, Texas and raised in Mission, TX. His father, Manfred Schuller, worked in the family real estate business while exploring new business opportunities. His mother, Kerry Moran, has worked for Coca-Cola Southwest Beverages for almost 30 years in various positions, from sales to training positions. His brother, Stingray Schuller, is a senior video producer at a state university in Texas and will marry his fiancé Jessica Zalenski in October of this year.

His mother faithfully raised him as a Catholic at Our Lady of Guadalupe parish in Mission, TX, where he received his sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. Bro. Chicago Joe was greatly impressed by the humility and passion of his parish priest, Fr. Roy Snipes, OMI, whose down-to-earth homilies always left him with life lessons. Those homilies, he states, made more sense when he finally started to take his faith seriously upon entering college at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, TX, where he met the Marianist brothers and priests.

Bro. Chicago is grateful for the many influential Marianists who inspired him along his journey. "Fr. Jim Tobin was the first Marianist I ever met. His gentle and prayerful presence helped me as I was rediscovering my faith with God and prayer with Mary. Fr.
