#### Introduction

On October 12, we remember Our Lady of the Pillar. In 1797, Blessed William Joseph Chaminade was forced to leave France. He chose to go to Saragossa, Spain, to live near and pray at a shrine dedicated to Mary, known as Our Lady of the Pillar. While praying at the Shrine, Chaminade was inspired to establish what we now know as the Family of Mary. Since 1888, this feast has been celebrated by Marianists to commemorate Blessed Chaminade's Marian inspiration.

### **Prayer**

## **Scripture Reading**

Luke 11: 27-28, RSVCE

As he said this, a woman in the crowd raised her voice and said to him, "Blessed is the womb that bore you, and the breasts that you sucked!"

But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"

Contemplate the following Marian text from the writings of Father Chaminade on honoring Mary.

. . . What do we commit ourselves to? To honor her with all our power, to spread her devotion, to instill confidence and devotion to her on all sides. We must not fear that the glory of God will be in any way diminished by this or that we will provoke a holy jealousy on God's part. Jesus loves his Mother tenderly, and there is nothing we can do more agreeable to him than to love and honor her as he himself has done.



On her part, what has Mary committed herself to? To protect us, to hear our prayers, to cherish us just as a mother cherishes her dearest children.
